

# KATOYA DAY CAMP

**For Girls Entering Grades 1-3 in the Fall**

## ONE-WEEK PROGRAMS

### CAMPTASTIC

July 5-9; July 12-16; July 19-23; July 26-30; August 2-6; August 9-13

FEE: \$195

Camp is a fantastic place to swim, sing, play games, explore the gardens and trails, and enjoy arts and crafts. Come and learn basic skills of knot tying, campfire building, tent pitching, and nature identification. You will also have a chance to cook in the outdoors.

## TWO-WEEK PROGRAMS

### HOPPY TO BE AT CAMP

July 5-16

FEE: \$350

Hop on in to the fascinating world of frogs! Games, arts and crafts, and nature exploration are just some of the ways we will learn about the camp mascot, Lily and her friends. You will also explore Katoya's famous frog pond and earn your Pondering Ponds patch. While at camp you will play hop scotch, jump rope, and leap frog.

### ART TO WEAR, ART TO SHARE

July 19-30

FEE: \$350

Decorate your clothes using tie-dye or batik, design your own hair clip or scrunchie. Wear your design in a camp fashion show. You will also make friendship bracelets and learn about S.W.A.P.s; an awesome Girl Scout tradition. Make your own autograph hound dog and have all of your new friends at camp sign it to enjoy your camp memories all year round.

### PUPPETS, DOLLS, AND FAIRIES

August 2-13

FEE: \$350

Create dolls and puppets and put on a puppet show with a real puppet stage. You will also explore the trails at camp and search for fairies. You will build fairy houses and learn about all the magical fairies at camp, and still have time to enjoy all the fun that camp has to offer; swimming, games, and outdoor cooking.

## For Girls Entering Grades 4-8 in the Fall

### ONE-WEEK PROGRAMS

#### CAMP JOURNEY

July 5-9; July 12-16; July 19-23; July 26-30; August 2-6; August 9-13

FEE: \$195

Girls will hike, swim, cook outdoors, and make arts and crafts designed for older girls. You will also participate in non-competitive games and outdoor skills such as tent pitching, campfire building, basic orienteering, and nature exploration.

#### HORSE FUN

July 5-9; July 12-16; July 19-23

FEE: \$380

This one-week horse program offers girls a chance to spend time at the stables and learn about horses. This includes grooming, feeding, tack, and stable management – as well as spending time in the saddle. Girls will receive one riding lesson each day. Girls are transported by bus to a local stable daily. They should be dressed in long pants (leggings are recommended) and wear a shoe with a 1" heel. Girls will have the opportunity to change into shorts after their riding lesson. Afternoons will be spent at Camp Katoya where they will have time to swim, play games, and create works of art.

#### TENNIS CLINIC

July 5-9; July 12-16; July 19-23

FEE: \$275

This one-week session offers girls the opportunity to learn tennis basics or improve their skills. Girls will receive four lessons provided by a professional tennis instructor. Girls should come prepared for a vigorous workout on the tennis court. You may bring your own racket or borrow one of ours. Afternoons will be spent at Camp Katoya where they will have time to swim, play games, and create works of art.

### TWO-WEEK PROGRAMS

#### KATOYA EXPLORATION

July 5-16

FEE: \$350

Explore the pond. Search for all the different species of frogs at Camp Katoya. Discover what other creatures live in the pond and earn your Pondering Ponds patch. Hike the trails and learn orienteering skills – learn to lay a trail and follow a trail. Create your own letterbox stamp and follow the clues for a letterbox hike at Camp Katoya. You will also explore all of the general camp activities like swimming, arts and crafts, and games.

## **Entering Grades 4-8 continued...**

### **ART MANIA**

July 19-30

FEE: \$350

This session you will learn some advanced art skills like stenciling, knitting, batik, or needlepoint. You will also create a mosaic and paint pottery. You may learn how to do glass etching and candle making. Anything is possible in this art filled camp session. Girls will also be able to participate in all of the general camp programming.

### **LIGHTS, CAMERAS, ACTION**

August 2-13

FEE: \$350

If you love drama, you will love this session at camp. Make masks, decorate your costumes, and practice putting on stage makeup. Write your own play, make the play bill, and then perform for your camp mates. You will also learn about stage setting and design and pick up a few acting skills. Girls will earn their Theatre badge!

## **For Girls Entering Grades 6-8 in the Fall**

## **TWO-WEEK PROGRAMS**

### **SPA-TACULAR**

July 5-16

FEE: \$350

Learn a little yoga and enjoy the serenity of camp. Prepare healthy snacks and smoothies and create a recipe book for home. Paint your nails and make homemade beauty treatments: lotions, facial scrubs, and bath oils. Make different types of candles and learn how to relax and live a stress free lifestyle.

### **A STITCH IN TIME**

July 19-30

FEE: \$350

This session girls will learn how to use a sewing machine. You will create a patchwork pillow and a simple bag to carry your camp things. Learn to use cutting tools, how to read a pattern, and how to sew on a button. As a group, create a memory quilt of fun things you did at camp to display at the Katoya Program Center.

### **KATOYA'S GOT TALENT**

August 2-13

FEE: \$350

This session is filled with songs, skits, line dancing, and creating art to display. Bring your special talent to camp and share it with all of your camp friends. Perform solo or with a group. Be a clown, a comedian, a gymnast, or a musician. All artisans will perform or display their works of art. Everyone is a star at Camp Katoya.

## Leadership Programs For Older Girls

### **LEAD (LEADERSHIP, EDUCATION, ADVENTURE, AND DEVELOPMENT) (8-12 GRADES)**

July 5-23

FEE: \$300

For girls entering grades 8-12 who are ready to take on a leadership role helping younger girls enjoy all of the great experiences of day camp. To ensure the knowledge, tools, and skills necessary to succeed as a LEAD are provided, participants will receive Program Aide Core Training and LEAD Training. LEADs assist Unit Leaders and Program staff to involve campers in program. An application and letter of interest is required for LEAD. ### **LEAD II (9-12 GRADES)**

July 26- August 13

FEE: \$475

For girls entering grades 9-12 who are ready to take on a leadership role helping younger girls enjoy all the great experiences of day camp. Participants will receive CPR certification and advanced outdoor specialist skills training. During the LEAD II program, applicants will spend one week as a group at Camp Candlewood in New Fairfield, CT August 1-7. LEAD II applicants must have completed one session of LEAD to apply.
