The steps explained below are how we do our best to maintain the integrity of the Gold Award and ensure girls will feel encouraged and empowered throughout the whole Gold process. Girls who work the closest with their Gold Award Committee mentors have the greatest success.

Prerequisites

- Earned Silver Award and 1 Senior/Ambassador Journey **OR**
- Earned 2 Senior/Ambassador Journeys

Interested in Gold Process?

- Research issues in your community
- Attend Gold Award Webinar

Paperwork

- *Attain, complete, and submit Gold Award Initial Project Plan Paperwork.* *upon submission you will be assigned a Gold Award Committee mentor
- Meet with Gold Award Committee mentor to discuss project issue and ideas. With the mentor complete the GSOFCCT Gold Award Proposal Paperwork.

Paperwork Continued

- Submit Gold Proposal Paperwork to Council
- Paperwork is then reviewed by Gold Award Committee

Project Approval

- Meet with your mentor again to discuss any changes to the project that may need to be made.
- Sign Gold Award Agreement with mentor.

Gold Project

- Once the Gold Award Agreement has been signed by both you and your mentor, you may begin your project.
- Remember to check in with your mentor monthly. Your mentor is there to offer support and guidance as you strive to achieve Gold. Communication is key

Final Report & Interview

- Once your Gold Award Project is finished, complete and submit the GSOFACT Gold Award Final Report.
- When your Final Report has been received you will be given a Final Interview. The Gold Award has been officially earned upon completing a successful Final Interview.
