**Requirement # 1:** Please use the form #5340 Site Reservation Application for GSofCT Users. Monday through Thursday, Camp Timber Trails is available without fee. There is a \$3 per person usage fee for Friday evenings and weekends.

**Requirement #2: Discover the camp!**

The Timber Trails mascot is a raccoon named Rocky. We do have real raccoons and other native animals at camp. To protect our wildlife, we never capture or play with wild animals. Like a real raccoon, Rocky is mischievous and often sneaks out at night and makes a mess and then hides from our summer campers. If the campers find him in their unit they must take care of him all day.

Camp Timber Trails has a Letterbox program that girls can participate in during the spring and fall. Girls can visit a letterboxing site to see what they would need to bring for basic tools and contact outdoor program for the letterboxing clues.

Camp Timber Trails opened officially opened in 1968 for approximately 300 girls per day. In 1969 the Beaver Ridge units opened for the first time as well as West Wind Program Center and the infirmary.

1971 was the first summer for the horseback riding program.

Timber Trails is entering its 43rd year as a Girl Scout residential summer camp. We sit on 1100 acres of pristine wooded terrain in the base of the Berkshire Mountains in Tolland, Mass.

The Infirmary  
The West Wind program Center  
Bending Trees Unit  
The Amphitheatre  
The Tasker House  
Windy Pines Merit Shelter

**Requirement #3: Connect with the property!**

Please have the group answer the question "What did you do today?" in Camp Timber Trails Reflection Journal. Take a moment and read what others groups have written and then share your group's story.

**Requirement #4: Take Action!**

Each group will need to complete a service project for the property. You can collect wood for a wood pile. Groups can clean, dust, wash windows at one of the camp buildings. You can rake

leaves and clear trails for future use. Groups wishing to do a larger project can contact Samantha Goodman in the Property Department for a Timber Trails wish list.

**Requirement #5: Live Healthy, Lead Healthy**

As part of the Girl Scout Live Healthy, Lead Healthy initiative, girls must either use the troop equipment to create some games that will challenge them physically, or learn about healthy snacks and prepare either a healthy snack option or a smoothie.
