Following a “Standards of Excellence” pathway, collaborating with leaders of influence, a community problem is solved and a sustainable and impactful solution developed to make the world a better place.

- Identify an issue to draw awareness to civic responsibility to the Girl Scout Promise and Law.
- Investigate the Issue thoroughly by leveraging a variety of sources, interview techniques, and publications to connect local challenges to national and/or global issues.
- Get help and build a team that values diverse point of views and recognizes the skills and strengths of others.
- Create a plan that engages the team and solidifies deadlines and tactics to create lasting change.
- Present the plan and gather feedback to improve and better a clearly articulated plan with desired outcomes and impact on self and the community.
- Take action to address the root cause of an issue by engaging the community and leveraging innovative problem-solving methods to define measureable outcomes, i.e.: address the root cause of an issue, create metrics for a measurable and sustainable impact, etc.
- Educate and inspire action with a robust report that is a roadmap for a sustainable project that can scale beyond the local community.
