Grades: 6-8

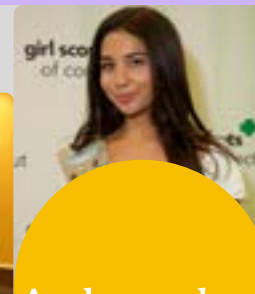
Cadettes develop relationships skills needed to be leaders. They are encouraged to work towards their SILVER AWARDS.

# Girl Scout Leadership Experience

Girl Scouts prepare for a lifetime of leadership, success, and adventure through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE). This proven leadership development program pairs girls with caring role models/mentors. Through engaging and fun activities (taking trips, selling products, exploring science, getting outdoors, serving the community), girls lead their own adventure and team up with others to choose the exciting, hands-on activities that interest them the most.

The experience takes Girl Scouts from ages 5 through 18 and are delivered through 4 pillars:



- ◆ **STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math**
- ◆ Spark interest in STEAM careers and prepare Girl Scouts for the modern-day workforce.
- ◆ Offerings include game coding, robot building, rocket launching, and STEAM camps.



- ◆ We are home to the largest girl-led entrepreneurial program in the world.
- ◆ Learn goal setting, decision making, people skills, money management, communication, and business ethics through Cookie Sales, Treats & Reads, and Cookies for Heroes.



- ◆ **Peer Connections:** Develop lifelong friendships through a supportive network of Girl Scouts.
- ◆ **Civic Engagement:** Build strong communication skills and contribute to communities through active participation.
- ◆ **Healthy Living:** Promote mental, physical, and emotional well-being through holistic activities.



- ◆ Explore nature with overnights, hikes, outdoor cooking, and imaginative quests, fostering connections and skills outside of digital spaces.
- ◆ Join weekend family camping trips, hikes, and more to strengthen bonds and create lasting connections.

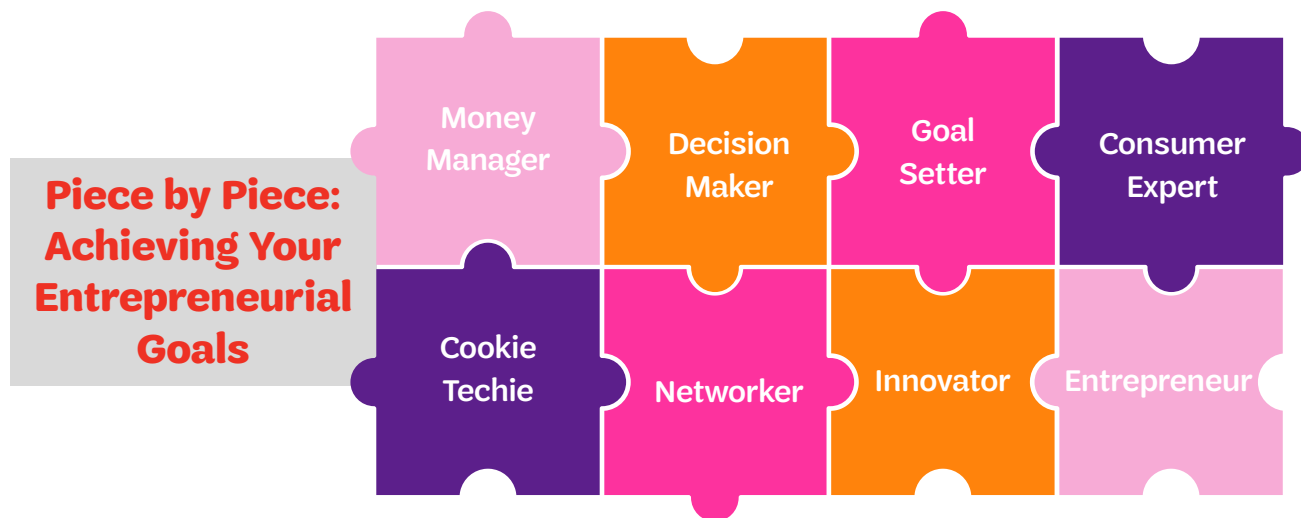


Through the product program, Girl Scouts learn five skills: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics. There are two product programs a year:

Girl Scouts offer nut and candy products, magazines, Girl Scout themed Bark Boxes, Tervis Tumblers, and high-quality personalized items. They get to use technology to grow their business by creating online storefronts featuring their avatar.

### The Cookie Program

The Iconic Girl Scout Cookie Program: The largest girl-led entrepreneurial program enables Girl Scouts to operate a business offering cookies in person, online, and at booths.

Kick off cookie season with sales during election week! Girl Scouts will begin learning their five skills: goal setting, decision making, money management, people skills, and business ethics. It's a fantastic way for troops to begin earning money for their treasury. Troops can sell cookies from **11/1/24 - 11/10/24** in a variety of ways, including booth sales.

### Cookies For Heroes

Cookies for Heroes, GSOFCT's Gift of Caring program, allows customers to support Girl Scout troops while also donating cookies to veterans, local heroes, and active-duty military personnel. Girl Scouts learn about philanthropy and the power of giving back.

### Girl Scouts garner essential skills through civic engagement:

#### ◆ **CEO Advisory Group** C S A

Students may apply to join the CEO Advisory Group. Meets virtually every month to share feedback with the CEO and leadership team.

#### ◆ **Council Delegate/Alternate** S A

Youth and Adult Members apply to serve as the Council Delegate or Alternate representing their service unit at mandatory bi-annual membership meetings and the Annual Meeting in April. Minimum age 14.

#### ◆ **National Delegate/Alternate** S A

Youth and Adult Members apply to serve as a National Delegate or Alternate representing CT at the next National Convention in Washington D.C. in July 2026. Mandatory monthly meetings. Minimum age 14.

#### ◆ **Girl Board Member** A

Rising high school juniors and seniors may apply to serve a one-year term on the GSOFCT Board of Directors. Girls are eligible to vote on board resolutions that do not involve contractual obligations. Meets five times a year.

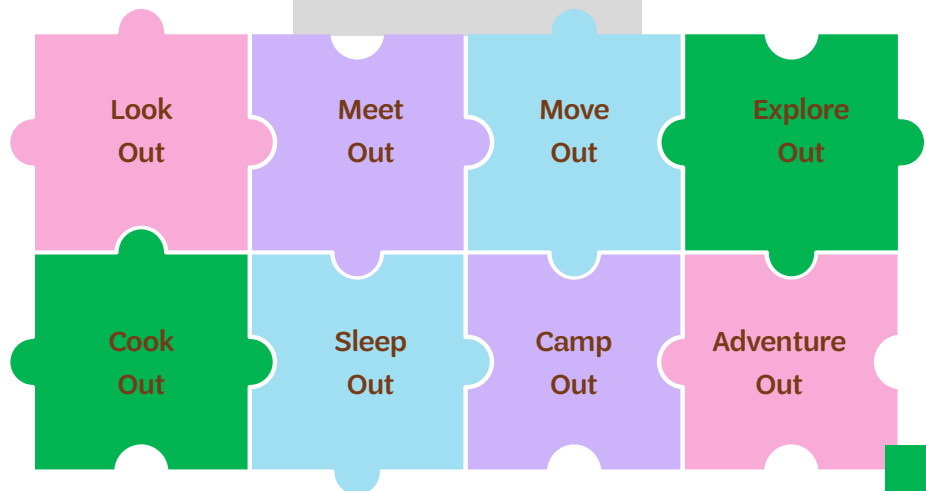

# Awards & Recognitions

## Highest Awards

Girl Scouts may achieve Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards by creating Take-Action projects aimed at making a positive impact in their communities. These awards challenge them to deliver sustainable solutions for lasting change:

- ◆ **Bronze Awards: Juniors** collaborate with peers to initiate local improvements.
- ◆ **Silver Awards: Cadettes** research issues, develop plans, and take action to enhance their communities.
- ◆ **Gold Awards: Seniors & Ambassadors** implement lasting solutions to local and broader issues, the highest accolade in Girl Scouting. Gold Award recipients may earn scholarships up to \$5,000.

These projects foster fulfillment and hone skills in organization, leadership, and project management, enhancing resumes and college applications.

### Note:

Girl Scouts pursuing their Gold Award must attend virtual trainings and can also participate in the High Five Project Prep series for guidance (see page 21).

## Religious Awards

### Girl Scouts and Faith - Celebrating Spirituality and Faith

Everything in Girl Scouting is based on the Girl Scout Promise and Law, which includes many of the principles and values across religions. While we are a secular organization, Girl Scouts has always encouraged its members to take spiritual journeys via their faith's religious recognitions.

### My Promise, My Faith

Girl Scouts of all grade levels can now earn the My Promise, My Faith pin, which complements existing religious recognitions and allows them to further strengthen the connection between their faith and Girl Scouts. Once each year, a Girl Scout can earn the My Promise, My Faith pin by carefully examining the Girl Scout Law and tying it directly to tenets of her faith. Requirements for this pin are included in The Girl's Guide to Girl Scouting for all levels.

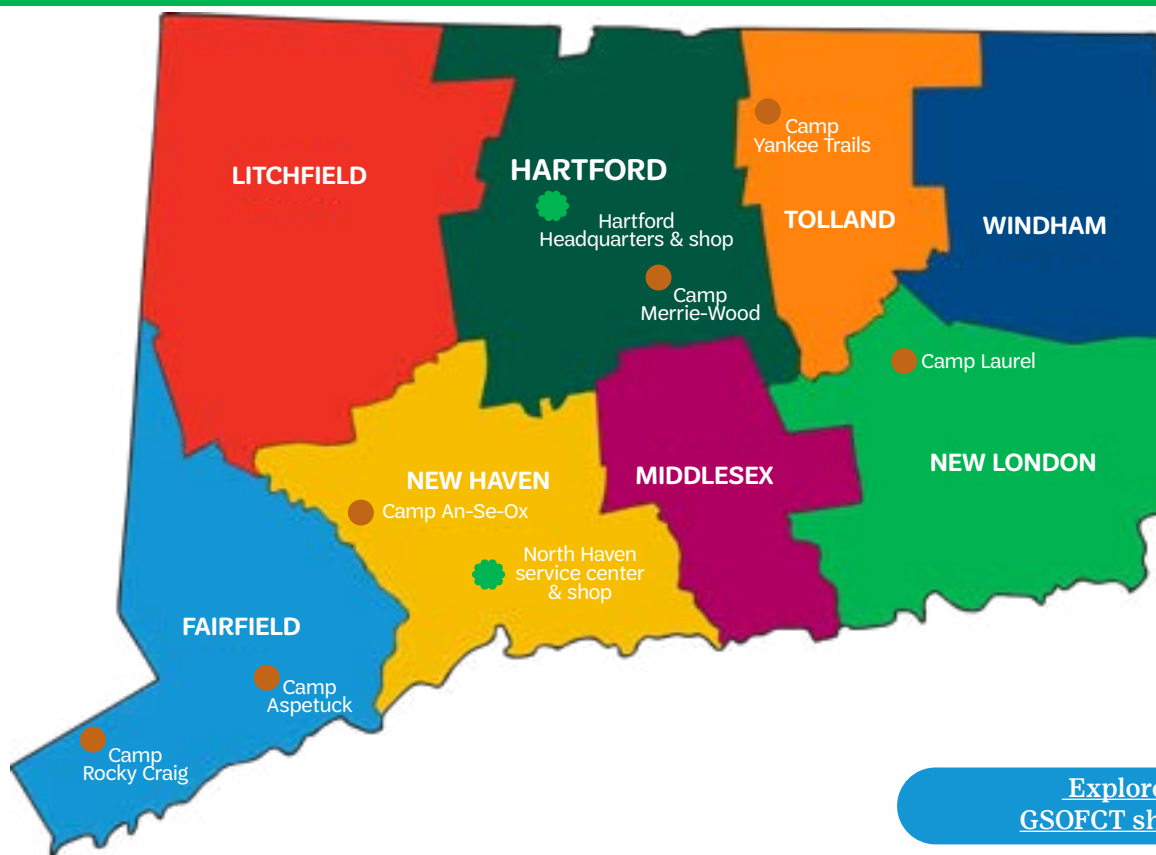

# How to Register for an Event

## Important Reminders before registering:

- ◆ All events are in Eastern Time.
- ◆ Virtual events are not recorded; missed sessions will not be sent.
- ◆ Girl Scouts of Connecticut is not liable for time zone differences, double bookings, forgetfulness, weather, or technical issues.
- ◆ Register early (30 days before the registration deadline / 45 days before the event ) for a discounted price.
- ◆ Membership is required for all attendees (exceptions for family events, where the girl must still be a member).
- ◆ Some events offer Financial Aid for girls; check the registration page for availability.
- ◆ Program titles offer levels and town information.

## How do I find events and register (from the calendar)?

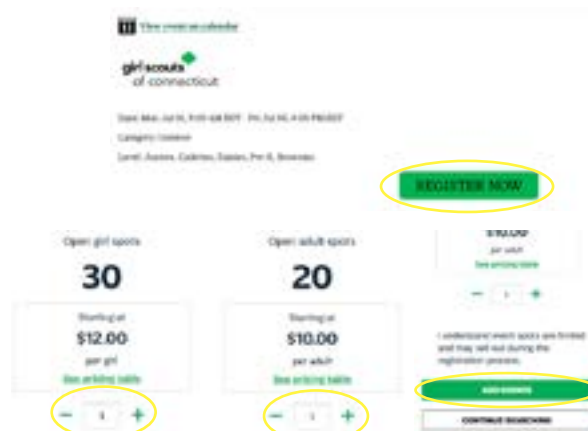
1. Scan QR code and click **List**, then find the event  
(or open a separate tab at: <https://www.gsofct.org/> and navigate to the **Events Calendar**.)
2. Click **VIEW DETAILS** then **REGISTER NOW**.
3. Select the amount of girls/adults you wish to register under **Open girl spots** and **Open adult spots**
4. Click **LOG IN** to sign into your myGS account or **ADD EVENTS** if you are already logged into myGS.
5. In the **Assign attendees** section for EACH participant you must assign an attendee
  - a. Select **My household** if you are only registering members from your household and select the attendee(s) from drop down menu -OR-
  - b. Select **My troop** if you are registering members from your troop and/or household and select the attendee(s) from drop down menu.
6. Under **Choose Payment options** section, checkmark the credit card payment box and click **SUBMIT MEMBER DETAILS**.
7. Click the **REVIEW CART**.
8. Checkmark "I agree to the Girl Scout Promise and Law."
9. Click **ADD PAYMENT DETAILS** and **SUBMIT PAYMENT**.
